A NOTE FROM OUR LAY LEADER

"There were two blind men sitting by the roadside, and when they heard that Jesus was passing by, they cried out, "Lord, have mercy on us, Son of David!" The crowd rebuked them, telling them to be silent, but they cried out all the more, "Lord, have mercy on us, Son of David!" And stopping, Jesus called them and said, "What do you want Me to do for you?" They said to Him, "Lord, let our eyes be opened." And Jesus, in pity, touched their eyes, and immediately they recovered their sight and followed Him. " — Matthew 20:30-34 ESV

I also have been drawn back to the Book of Acts early this summer. It reminds us so much about the importance of active discipleship. First Church has an awesome history of active missions and active outreach. It is hard to capture the full list of our ministries.

August 4 Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost Texts: Ephesians 4:1-16; John 6:24-35 Title: "Who Are We In Christ?" "What must we do in order to accomplish what God requires?" (John 6:28) What are the traits of a Jesus follower?

<u>August 11</u> Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost Texts: Ephesians 4:25-5:2; John 6:35, 41-51 Title: "The Truth of It All" "Each of you must tell the truth to your neighbor because we are parts of each other in the same body." (Ephesians 4:25b) From death to life, Paul reminds the Ephesians to live in community, as they strive to be imitators of Christ.

<u>August 18</u> Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost Texts: Ephesians 5:15-20; John 6:51-58 Title: "Living Christ" "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever, and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." Being in Christ produces behaviors acting in love and countering hate.

Title: "Edge Walkers"

LONDON 2025: Church History & Faith Today Trip

We **(Suamico UMC)** are going to England on May 24th to celebrate John Wesley Day and explore the church history that led to the Methodist Movement. Tentative Dates: We will depart Tuesday, May 20, 2025, and return Wednesday, May 28, 2025. *We will fly midweek for reduced airfare costs.* We plan to order plane tickets in November 2024. The initial payment of \$1200 is due October 31, 2024. Remainder due February 28, 2025.

The following information describes the activities for this trip. All details are tentative as of April 2024, with final details to be posted. Tentative Cost: \$2500 per person, double occupancy in hotel. The cost includes airfare, hotel, Westminster and St. Paul's entry, Wesley's Chapel fees, a Big Red Bus tour, and a water taxi. Local transportation, food, donations for church visits, the Tower of London, and other personal expenses are not included.
