#### Social Justice Principles

Description: Capturing the Wesleyan spirit of social holiness and ethical action, over 4,000 United Methodists from around the world participated in an eight-year process to review and update the United Methodist Social Principles.

Completed in 2020, this new draft document reflects the United Methodist response to today's most pressing social issues and was adopted at the General Conference 2024. Using the Revised UM Social Principles document as the basis for the class, the class will look at the Economic Communities and the Political Communities and will reflect upon the character of the Economic and Political Communities we are building. Each participant will receive a copy of the final draft to guide the discussion. Rev. Lanman will share some of her social principles book collection that will further the study of social principles. The class will begin on **September 15**<sup>th</sup> and continue through October 13<sup>th</sup> (9-10:00 am).


#### **Disciple Bible Study**
