May we see this time of stewardship as our opportunity to give back to God what is truly God's!







FUMCWA MINISTRIES

Book Discussion Group: On Monday, October 21st, at 1:30 pm, the group will discuss *Echoes of Grace* by Guadalupe Garcia McCall (Social Action.) This triumphant new novel explores sisterhood, family secrets, inter-generational trauma, life, and love in a modern Gothic setting with a magical realist twist.
