We Wait with Hope and Long for Christ's Return: Each year during Advent, we celebrate Christ's birth and anticipate His return. I love Advent at First Church. I like to treat it much like Lent in my study and preparation. I love the music in the Church. I love the decorations. I love the longest night. I love seeing you all in the sanctuary and the halls.

It is a 4-week study.

Death will be no more; grief, crying, and pain will be no more, because the previous things have passed away).

We do and always will care about every member of our church family. Please contact Pastor Grace, our church office, or Laura Molleson if you feel you'd like to be contacted by a member of our Care Team.

As with the change of the seasons, we often find things in the church's life that can change. Pastor Grace, Laurie Halvorsen, and I (Laura Molleson) have been in prayerful discussion about combining two ministries that closely complement each other. Our Wesleyan Congregational Care Team (WCCT) and the Visitation Ministry have both a similar mission and purpose. It makes sense that we consider blending these two ministries into one after the first of the year.

Both the Visitation Ministry and WCCT are here to serve our congregational family. We are always here for those present in church or any of our church family members currently unable to attend regularly. Both ministries are meant to be a support to everyone in need.



A Program of Prison Fellowship

On November 24th, a Christmas tree was set up in the narthex decorated with paper angels. Each angel represents the gift wish of a child whose parent is incarcerated. You can select one or more angels from the tree, purchase the gift listed, wrap it, and **return it to our church no later than 10:30 am on Sunday, December 15th**. At the conclusion of the church service on December 15<sup>th</sup>, volunteers will be needed to deliver the gifts to the children's homes. It can be as simple as dropping off a package on your way home from church, and anyone can volunteer, regardless of whether you participated in the gift portion of this ministry. This year our church will serve approximately 30 children and their parents through the Angel Tree. It can be our way of



Adult Christian Education Invitation From Bonnie Chesky: We read in the book of Hebrews 10:24 that we are responsible as faithful followers of Jesus Christ to encourage one another in "good deeds". #### Heaven and Earth: Advent and the Incarnation by William H. Willimon

In this four-week Advent study, William Willimon introduces us to the God who does just that: he brings heaven to earth and changes everything.
